- We offer comprehensive K-12 programs in art, music, physical education, gifted & talented, English as a Second Language, special education, and service learning.
- Students are able to earn college credit or advanced standing through Advanced Placement, and more than 20 courses are articulated with MATC.
- Youth apprenticeships and special programs are available in Finance, Health Services, Manufacturing, and Prostart Certification.
- Following graduation, 87% of the senior class goes on to a two or four year college.
- South Milwaukee seniors earned over \$1.5 million in scholarships in 2013.


